**Position Start Dates:** January 2024, April 2024, July 2024. (Also available for 2025 and 2026)

**Job Duties**

1. Provide Clinical Supervision and teaching for a minimum of three months:
  - Review dysphagia lecture materials, exam materials, and workshop materials from university course.
  - Supervise Cambodian dysphagia clinical trainees in their practicum training, as they assess/treat dysphagia patients in acute, adult, inpatient setting, including hands-on supervision for screens, evaluations, chart reviews, communication with other medical personnel, referral pathways, treatment planning, documentation, and the like.
  - Conduct periodic Saturday morning in-person workshops for students, including role- play, case-study presentations, and the like (outline will be provided)
2. Identify, report, and problem-solve with course coordinator any issues impacting on clinical delivery by Cambodian trainees (e.g. record keeping/data collection, referral pathways, performance issues).
3. Participate in program development: Collaborate with Cambodian healthcare facilities to grow and develop dysphagia service structures, prioritizing quality and sustainability.

## **Personal Qualifications**

- Speech and Language Pathologist/ Therapist (MS/MA, CCC or higher in US, or Qualified in other countries)
- Experience supervising speech therapy students/ new professionals
- Able to work with a high level of mental flexibility, in the context of rapidly changing plans and schedules; comfortable and unperturbed in the face of the unexpected
- Very strong organizational and time management skills
- Innovative, enthusiastic and creative team player; highly effective professional communication in order to work with multiple organizations implementing the course
- Professional English language skills (native speaker / fluent English as an additional language)
- Possess a strong sense of adventure, a good sense of humor, and a healthy work ethic

## **Essential Cross-Cultural Experience**

- Record of effective working in cross-cultural /multi-cultural context
- Experience working with and through interpreters
- Experience living in or at least traveling in low-resourced countries such as in Southeast Asia, Africa, Central America, and the like
- Demonstrate an interest in and appreciation of Asian cultures.

## **Funding and extras**

- This is a Grant-funded position. All living expenses are generously covered: housing, international airfare, meals, internal transportation, health and travel insurance, contingencies (sick leave, unexpected expenses, etc.)
- Workweek can sometimes be 4 days, depending on need
- Grant agents obtain work permit, and support for obtaining visa (official letters, etc.)
- Costs for work permit and visa are covered by the Grant
- Assistance in finding airline flights to Cambodia is provided by the Grant agents.
- A comfortable, centrally located two-bedroom shared apartment (private rooms for each of two SLPs) in Phnom Penh will be provided by Grant agents.
- Any work-related expenses are covered by the Grant (internal travel, work-related lodging, etc.)
- Paid sick leave is taken on an as-needed basis, with no set number of days. If long- term, or frequent sick leave is needed, this will be discussed with management

- Opportunity to help Cambodian patients in great need
